


Study options for MSc and PhD students

NOVA provides you as a Master's or PhD student an opportunity to take specialised courses at another Nordic university and to meet fellow students in your field. Courses are in general intensive courses of about one to two weeks. In some areas there are also full programmes or semesters available.

Scholarships

There are no scholarships for PhD-students attending a NOVA course or network project, accommodation and meals are however included in the course. Master's students can apply for scholarships that cover additional travel and living costs.







Interview with a previous NOVA student

Hannu Hotti is 29 years old and is currently a research scientist, working on his PhD in biotechnology at the University of Helsinki.

1. When and how did you come to hear about the NOVAnetwork?

- First time I heard about NOVA was when I was on a joint plant pathology course in 2005. The course was collaboration between SLU Uppsala and University of Helsinki.

2.You took quite a few NOVA courses.

Yes, during the autumn 2005 I took Plant-microbe interactions and molecular defence of plants, 2009
Plant Pathology in a Changing World, a Master's Summer Course, in 2011
Breeding for Adaptation to Climate
Change, a NOVA PhD-course and in 2012 I took Pre-Breeding for Sustainable Plant Production, also a NOVA
PhD-course.

3. Was there something special that made the NOVA courses interesting to you?

- What made the NOVA courses very interesting was that they were held abroad, in a new university environment, with new teachers and new fellow students. The courses were interesting topic wise, as well.

4. Did you make any lasting contacts during the course?

– I made few contacts during the courses that I'm holding on to.

5. Would you recommend the NOVA courses to other possible participants?

- Yes, absolutely, you get to experience new things in new places.
